Cost

The estimated cost of constructing the annexe and the various fees that are likely to be incurred is £350,000.

With some money already in the bank and the indication of a loan by the Church of Scotland General Trustees, we are on our way to achieving this target. However, significant funds are still required and we expect to apply for funding from external organisations later this year. To help support these applications we need to understand what finance we are able to raise ourselves.

What is a pledge?

A pledge is a promise to give money to help fund the construction of the new annexe, either via a one-off lump sum gift or in instalments over a period of time. A pledge is an important commitment made in accordance with the resources the Lord has given you.

Why should I pledge?

Pledging is important because, combined with other funding, it enables us to plan the financing of the annexe construction work.

We are hoping to receive a loan from the General Trustees that will likely be repaid over a 5 or 7 year period. The pledges received will help us in obtaining and paying back this loan.

If 50 people/families were to give £50 a month over a 5 year period then that would raise £150,000 plus any Gift Aid.

If 70 people were to give £30 a month over a 5 year period that would raise £126,000 plus Gift Aid

Translating pledges into cash

We want to do everything we can to translate pledges into cash in the bank as soon as possible. In order to plan and progress the associated building works and to seek the necessary additional funding that may be required, we need to know by the end of **June 2017** what money we can expect to raise from pledges.
